




United Way Programs Impacting our Community



2-1-1 Florida Panhandle - A resource and referral service and the first place to call when you don't know where to call. Answered 24 hours / 7 days a week 365 days a year. In 2016, the 2-1-1 operators took 3,208 calls relating to "utility services assistance: 1,824 calls for "rent assistance, housing and shelters"; 1,206 calls for needing food or meals; 864 health related calls; and 657 substance abuse and mental health calls. A total of 7,759 people calling for help.



Children's Summer Fun Guidebook - Community resources to assist parents to find safe, fun and educational activities for children during the summer. Beginning in May, over 500 hard copies are distributed throughout Okaloosa and Walton Counties. The Guidebook can be downloaded from United Way website. www.united-way.org



Coats for Kids at Christmas - Community coat drive for children. 2016 Stats - collected and distributed over 1800 coats for children in Okaloosa and Walton Counties. Fifteen Partner Agencies assisted in distributing coats; 90 local businesses were drop-off locations; Bangkok Cleaners, Destin Cleaners & ResortQuest cleaned the coats; and A&A Transfer provided the boxes.



Cram the Van - Saturdays in July and August ...in 2016, the Okaloosa Public School Foundation and volunteers from 24 Okaloosa District Schools collected over 5,361 pounds of school supplies during July. Nine other United Way Partner Agencies collected supplies to assist their clients or local schools. Thanks to our sponsors: Lee Automotive Group, Cumulus Radio and Walmart.



Day of Caring - September...organized by United Way and is the largest volunteer day of service that provides individuals the opportunity to learn the needs of the community while helping nonprofits, schools & our local parks. 2016 Stats: 862 volunteers, from 80 businesses, completed 68 projects and worked 3,448 hours of service in Okaloosa and Walton Counties; with a total value of \$76,132 in service to our community.



Familywize - A prescription assistance program which is a longtime partner of United Way, working with nearly 1,000 local United Ways dedicated to helping improve the health and well-being of individuals, families and communities. In 2016, this program helped 8 729 people in Okalogoa County coved \$221,270. In Welliam Co. helped 8,729 people in Okaloosa County saved \$231,378. In Walton County, 1,511 people saved \$32,509.



Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive - United Way has partnered with the National Association of Letter Carriers for the past 18 years to organize the Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive. All collected food items are distributed to our Partner Agencies and local food banks. The food drive is held the second Saturday of May to help replenish our food banks. In 2016, Okaloosa and Walton Counties collected over 169,784 pounds of food and distributed to 23 local food banks.



VITA - Volunteer Income Tax Assistance. United Way partners with IRS to provide FREE tax assistance to residents with low-to-moderate income and assists eligible taxpayers in claiming any special credits and deductions. 2016 - volunteers processed 239 tax returns, kept \$156,319 in our community and saved \$28,680 in preparation fees.





OKALOOSA-WALTON FUND DISTRIBUTION COMMITTEE

Allocating funds to programs for United Way of Okaloosa-Walton Counties' Partner Agencies is a very involved process . Many trained volunteers from within our community serve on the Fund Distribution Committees spending several months carefully analyzing our community's needs, evaluating the performance and impact of agency programs and studying funding requests.
